Finance: The NZ dollar dropped significantly over the week after the Reserve Bank lifted the OCR. The lower dollar will have a major effect on petrol prices over the Christmas holiday period, so be prepared!!.

Wool: Wool prices remain in the doldrums however there was some light at last weeks auction but thought to be just a stock rebalancing by the major buyers.

Beef, Sheep & Venison schedules: Schedules are steady in most categories with some minor intercompany changes.

Dairy Prices The dairy prices have all lifted in US dollar terms but with the lower NZ dollar the increase in price looks more dramatic than it real is. Dairy commodity prices are still very strong.
